City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday July, 15 2014
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order and the record showed that Councilman Pat Jordan, Councilwoman Sorg and Councilman Bob Basham were all present. City Manager Cris Meadows, Fire Chief Ray Pivont and City Attorney Richard Gunnoe were also in attendance. Councilman Meador was present by teleconference.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – Lynn Maddy led the prayer and the pledge of allegiance.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the agenda. Councilman Basham seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Jordan moved to approve the minutes of the June 2014 regular city council meeting and the June Special Meeting. Councilman Basham seconded the motion council discussed to change the meeting time for the special meeting and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
