City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday, February 20, 2018
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order, and the record showed that Councilman Pat Jordan, Councilman Jack Scott and Councilwoman Roberta Sorg were present. Councilman Meador was absent.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – City Manager Cris Meadows led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the agenda. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 3-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Jordan moved to approve the minutes of the January Regular Council Meeting. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 3-0.
5. Approval of Paid Invoices – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the paid invoices. Councilman Scott seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 3-0.
6. Approval of Financial Report January 2017 – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the financial report. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 3-0.
7. Approval of annual project prioritization – Cris went over the list of projects and their current status. Council agreed with the projects and moved demolition up the list.
